- 15 My frame was not hidden from you  
when I was made in the secret place,  
when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.
- 16 Your eyes saw my unformed body;  
all the days ordained for me were written in your book  
before one of them came to be.

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# Discovering Your Spiritual Gifts

Understanding and utilizing your spiritual gifts is essential for fulfilling God's purpose for your life. This section helps you identify and embrace these gifts.

**What Are Spiritual Gifts?** Spiritual gifts are special abilities given by the Holy Spirit to every believer, intended for the common good of the church and effective ministry. They are tools God provides to help His people fulfill their callings.

## 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. 5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. 7 Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, 10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues,[a] and to still another the interpretation of tongues.[b] 11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

## Romans 12:6-8

6 We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; 7 if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; 8 if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

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# Community in Discerning Your Calling

Understanding and embracing your calling is not a journey you must undertake alone. The Christian community plays a crucial role in affirming and sharpening our understanding of how God has designed us to serve.

## Acts 13:1-3

1 Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. 2 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." 3 So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

This passage shows the early church in Antioch fasting, praying, and then laying hands on Barnabas and Saul, affirming their call to missionary work.

## 2 Timothy 1:6

6 For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands.

Paul reminds Timothy to "fan into flame the gift of God," a gift that was affirmed through the laying on of hands by Paul and the elders.

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# Aligning Your Calling with God's Will

## Practical Steps to Align With God's Will

- **Prayer:** Constantly seek God's guidance in prayer, asking Him to clarify and direct your path.
- **Scripture:** Regularly immerse yourself in Scripture. The Bible not only provides general guidance but often speaks directly into our circumstances.
- **Wise Counsel:** Seek the advice of godly mentors who can provide biblical insight and objective advice on your perceived calling.

## Proverbs 3:5-6

5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart  
and lean not on your own understanding;  
6 in all your ways submit to him,  
and he will make your paths straight.

## James 1:5

5 If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.

## 1 Peter 4:10

10 Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.
